### A.C.W. CHRISTMAS SALE

The annual Christmas Sale hosted by the Anglican Church Women of our parish will be held on **Saturday, November 25**. Doors open at 10:00 am and there will be something for everyone—fudge, home cooking, books, new-to-you, Christmas items and more. There will also be a silent auction table with lots of treasures. Tea, coffee and sweets will be served.

In other ACW news, members will meet in the Parish Hall on **Tuesday, December 12**, to assemble Christmas trays for the elderly and shut-in members of our parish.

The ACW meets the second Tuesday of each month in the Parish Hall at 2:00 pm, unless otherwise announced; new members are always welcome. In addition to supporting various ministries in our parish and diocese, they also sponsor 4 students at Bishop McAllister College and Seminary in Kyogyera, Uganda. A donation piggy bank is in the entryway of the church if you would like to contribute to this support. At present, a new library is being planned for the school, so if you would like to donate to that project, please mark your donation appropriately and give it to an ACW member or place it on the collection plate when you come to church or bring it to the Parish Office. It will then be forwarded to Canon Paul Jeffries, Principal of the College. (Recently, I received an email from Paul with a picture of Fredrick Beinomugisha, a graduate of the College sponsored by our ACW. He now works for IBM International in Nairobi, Kenya, and has given a generous donation to the library fund. I have put his picture in the entryway of the church, near the above mentioned piggy bank.)

It is not always possible for me to be at Evening Prayer on days I am visiting the hospital, making pastoral calls or attending meetings, so volunteers to assist at the afternoon services are especially welcome.
