ROOM

There is room. - St. Luke XIV. 22

June gives us the Feast of the Sacred Heart, the Heart that has room for all the world, the Heart of God. The point of this parable is not so much that the people who were asked stayed away from the banquet as their attitude of mind towards the Lord of Life Who has bidden them come. In the parallel passage in S. Matthew's Gospel we are told that they "made light of it." It was a stupid misunderstanding of the mind of God to think that they could not bring to Him for consecration those very things that kept them away. The people are roughly of three types - a man of property, a labourer, and a lover. Our Lord says "Don't you think you could have brought your property to Me that I might bless it? Do you think your oxen are not of interest to Me? Do you think the tender love of your heart is not precious to Me? Your fields won't walk away, and your oxen will be all the better for a rest, and surely you could bring your wife to the banquet. There is room."

There is room in God's heart for every temperament and every type. There is room in this world, as there is in the parable, for everybody, and work enough and food enough, if the world were really guided by Christian principles. What we believe about God affects our way of praying, and our prayer affects our whole life. If we think about God in this way, as a God Who has room for the whole world and wants the whole world to come to Him, it will make our prayer much wider. This world "room" brings to us the thought of the splendor and the greatness of the Sacred Heart. Father Andrews - Meditations

We pray for the leaders of the nations, remembering Elizabeth, our Queen, Justin and Brian, her first ministers, Karen and John, our representatives in government, and the leaders in all the communities in which we live. **Lord, in your mercy, R:** Hear our prayer.

V: We pray that he may reveal the light of his presence to the sick, the weak and the dying, to comfort and strengthen them.
